Key Race of the Day – Race 6 – Allowance – About 7 Furlongs (Turf)

The Tuesday nightcap features a competitive field of eight in search of their third lifetime win. **#5 Kid Gizmo** looked excellent winning her Fort Erie turf debut by nearly three lengths. She stalked the pace beautifully and kicked on nicely in the stretch, which once again, could be the ideal trip in a spot that's perfect for her next start. Also, it's promising that Juan Crawford sticks with this filly, as over the last year, he's six for sixteen when riding for trainer Roy Agostino. **#6 Gambler's Pose** capped off her four-year-old season with a turf win at today's distance against allowance-level N2L. She was able to rally from off the pace under Leo Salles, who has been her pilot since. In her two starts this year, she fell the victim of bad weather, as both events were moved to the main track, but on a positive note, she took a step forward in her most recent start. She figures to take a massive step forward returning to the grass, which is her preferred surface. **#8 Moral Turpitude** was claimed out of her most recent start for \$15k by Deborah Fletcher and now ends up in the barn of John Simms, who has had a stellar meet so far and is five for ten off the claim the last two years. This mare finished fourth last time out after breaking at the back of the pack of a compact field. She figures to be rolling from off the pace and will need pace help, but her class may carry her here.
